

JANUARY MISSION FOCUS FEEDING AMERICA

Feeding America serves 40 of Michigan's 83 counties from the Indiana border north through the western half of the state and the entire upper Peninsula. We are making a difference in our community at SUMC and one way is by proving the monthly mobile food pantry the third Wednesday of each month.

This year we have served the following: 1,425 Households: 3,958 Individuals: 1,425 Seniors: 1,233 Children: and 307 Veterans

We are so blessed to have the financial support of our church and community as well as our awesome volunteers.

We want to thank the co-chairs of our church fair booth for donating half of our church's proceeds from the fair to support the mobile food pantry in 2024. January mission of the month is our Feeding America Mobile Food Pantry. Hopefully, this will finish raising the money needed to continue supporting our mobile food pantry in 2024. The cost to Feeding America to bring the truck for the mobile food pantry is \$1,000.00 for 100 households and \$1200.00 for 100 to 150 households.

Each year we make a pledge donation to Feeding America. In January we will make the pledge again.

We hope you consider this mission to support in 2024 and the years to follow.
